The German verb "schnappen" translates as "to snap" or "to grab," an apt description of the way in which these spirits are typically enjoyed - a quick shot taken without garnish or mixers. Apples, cherries, pears, plums, raspberries, countless spices and herbs - the flavors are as varied as the occasions for enjoying them. They are frequently taken as an after-dinner digestif, or as a way to cheerfully mark a special occasion. Often, they are simply the perfect way to toast "friendship and happy times" (Gemutlichkeit).

Apfelkorn (Apple)

Sweet apples blended with wheat spirits, popular with those who enjoy a milder schnaps \$5
25% ABV

Birne (Pear)



The original Kammer Birne brandy, made with 100% Williams pears, double distilled and matured in earthenware jugs. A pear is grown inside each bottle before being filled with this premium fruit spirit. On the palate, it is soft and rounded, offering up a balanced interplay between pear and herbal flavors \$9

Himbeergeist (Raspberry)

Made with wild forest raspberries from the Carpathians. A clean, fresh hint of raspberry for an assertive, but not overly sweet flavor \$6
42% ABV

Kirschwasser (Cherry)



Literally, "cherry water." Distilled from black, fully ripened cherries of the Black Forest, Kirschwasser is naturally aromatic and has a distinct fruity flavor \$6

Obstler (Fruit variety)



Made in southwest Germany with a mix of apple and pear flavors, for the connoisseur who prefers the complexities of blends \$5
40% ABV

Pflaume (Plum)



A favorite among friends across Europe. If you have roots in central Europe, you can rest assured your ancestors have enjoyed this schnaps \$5
20% ABV
